**Clarification of Commercial License Timeline**

1. In January all of the license holders will receive a sticker from the Town to put on the back of their license which will extend them until June 30, 2017. This will be done at no extra cost for the 3 month extension. The new license period will run from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018.
2. Due to the 3 month extension there will be a one-time conservation hour requirement to obtain 6 hours of reseeding, 1 survey, and a total of 14 hours of conservation time for a renewal license for 2017-2018. This is an increase of 2 hours for reseeding and total time. Student conservation time remains at 4 hours of any type of time – no increase.
3. For the 2017-2018 License period (July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018) the fees will increase as follows:

Resident	\$200	\$350
Non-Resident	\$400	\$550
Student	\$75	\$75

4. Timeline for License Year 2017-2018

Conservation Hours Credit Period	March 1, 2016 to May 31, 2017
DMR License Approval	Prior to January 15, 2017 for the first year Prior to April 15th for following years
Applications Due	During Month of May 2017
Renewal License Pickup	From June 16th to June 30th
New License Pickup	From July 1st to July 14th
General License Pickup	After July 14th

**Clarification on Recreational License Timeframe**

1. Recreational License holders will pick up their licenses starting March 15, 2017 as in the past and will have them valid until June 30, 2018 (15 month period).
2. The Recreational licenses will increase from \$20 to \$25 for Residents and \$25 to \$30 for Non-Residents starting with the 2018-2019 licensing period. This will put the Recreation Licenses on the same July to June time period as the Commercial Licenses, but one year later which is also when the fee increase would kick in.
